ENAC'S DIRECTOR GENERAL, ALESSANDRO QUARANTA, VISITS MILAN BERGAMO AIRPORT

This morning (30th October), ENAC's Director General, **Alessio Quaranta**, visited Milan Bergamo Airport accompanied by the President, **Roberto Bruni**, the Director General, **Emilio Bellingardi**, and some management representatives from SACBO, the airport's management company.

Milan Bergamo Airport is one of Italy's most important national airports: it's the third biggest airport in terms of both passenger numbers and transported freight and has recorded significant annual growth which has been confirmed by data for the first six months of 2018.

The company's senior management showed Mr. Quaranta some of the principal points of its activities, including:

- the airport's 2015-2030 Development Plan which forecasts €435m of company investment:
- the company's current status and the value that the airport's activities generate for the area, including 8% of provincial GDP, and more than 17,000 direct and indirect jobs;
- the airport's rail link, which has high strategic development value, supporting complete inter-modality of transport which integrates the area's motorway and road network with the rail network and also with the airport.

SACBO also showed its institutional video which will be posted on its social media channels from today.

The meeting continued with a visit to the airport's infrastructure, which will soon see the start of works to expand the terminal, and the north area building site where new aprons are being built to house 8 Class C or 4 Class E aircraft, which will be available for use from the end of the year.
