400 thousand passengers fly from Milan Bergamo Airport during the Christmas holidays

Almost 400 thousand passengers have chosen to fly from Milan Bergamo Airport in the period between the week before Christmas and 31 December. The airlines operating from the airport have organised a series of additional flights in response to the demands of travellers, increasing weekly frequency on scheduled routes.

Between 20 December and 7 January, 150 flights have been added, providing approximately 27 thousand additional flights from the airport. Ryanair has added 14 weekly flights on routes to the south of Italy and the islands: 4 more to Brindisi, 3 for Lamezia, 2 for Palermo, Catania and Cagliari, and one more for Trapani. Ryanair has increased, above all, weekly frequencies for Spain: 3 extra flights towards Fuerteventura, Lanzarote and Malaga, 2 for Las Palmas and Seville. Sicily is also served by extra flights operated by Albastar (3-weekly to Catania and 1 to Palermo) and Meridiana (two weekly flights to Palermo). Wizz Air has provided for additional flights to all destinations served in Romania, and an additional weekly flight to Katowice and Krakow in Poland, and Sofia in Bulgaria.

Pobeda Airlines is running twice-daily flights to Moscow until 14 January, New Year's Day for the Orthodox calendar. Morocco is served by one additional weekly flight operated by Air Arabia to Casablanca, while Ryanair has programmed three extra weekly flights to Marrakech, and one to Fez.

Pegasus Airlines is running two additional weekly flights to Istanbul, from where it is possible to connect with other flights towards destinations in the Persian Gulf, the Middle East and Southern Asia.
