

## WINTER SCHEDULE FOR FLIGHTS IN EFFECT FROM 30 OCTOBER NEWS FROM THE MILAN BERGAMO AIRPORT

On Sunday 30 October 2016, coinciding with the winter flight schedule entering into force, Milano Bergamo Airport will introduce a series of important changes regarding flight connections. The daily flight with Moscow Vnukovo Airport, operating with Pobeda Airlines from the Aeroflot Group with the B737-800 aircraft equipped with 189 seats, has increased its frequency to 11 times a week, with a second daily flight operating from Thursday to Sunday. The added arrival flights from Moscow land at 9:30 local time, departing at 10:00 for the Russian capital. The expected afternoon flights on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday will arrive at 14:55 local time and depart for Moscow at 15:25; on Thursday, Friday and Sunday they will arrive at 17:15 local time and depart at 17:45.

As many as seven new changes have been introduced to Ryanair's winter schedule, with connections to Danzig (three flights a week: Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday), Hamburg, Nuremberg and Prague (daily), Ostrava (bi-weekly, Thursday and Sunday), Timișoara (every day, except Wednesday and Sunday), and Niš in Serbia (bi-weekly, Tuesday and Saturday).

Blue Air announced the opening of a new route to Liverpool commencing 26 March 2017, and increased its frequency of flights with Bacău to four times a week (Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday).

The aeroplane company Wizz Air, which operates 18 connections with the Milan Bergamo airport, will introduce the new A321ceo aircraft (already operational on the Bucharest route) to Sofia (from February 2017) and Warsaw (from March 2017).

A new connection between the airports of Nice and Milan Bergamo will commence from 28 October 2016, with APG Airlines in a turboprop Beechcraft 200. The flights are bi-weekly (Friday and Sunday) departing from Nice at 17:30 and arriving in Bergamo at 18:35, where it departs at 19:00 to land in Nice Côte d'Azur airport at 20:05.
